Teachers will continuously work to ensure all students are actively engaged in the learning process. All teachers will use engagement strategies for students to interact with both the teacher and other peers. All teachers will implement and teach Tier 1 small groups consistently so that targeted skills re identified and taught in a smaller group setting. Teachers will also place an emphasis on building background and intentionally teaching vocabulary as it applies to grade level content.

Teachers and administration regularly review various data points to ensure students are receiving the instruction and learning opportunities they need. Instruction is then modified or adapted to meet specific student needs.
